



## Winter 2018 Class Supply List: Beginning Watercolor / 8WAC4oTB

*(Please see new policy re: class supplies below this list.)*

- **Paints:**
  - Lemon Yellow
  - Cadmium Yellow
  - Cadmium Red
  - French Ultramarine Blue or Ultramarine Blue
  - Yellow Ochre
  - Alizarin Crimson
  - Raw Umber
  - Burnt Sienna
  - Cerulean blue
  - Cobalt blue
  - Phthalo blue
  - Phthalo green
  
- **Paper:**
  - 140 lb. or higher Cold Press Watercolor paper or pad, rough or smooth at least 10" x 14"
  - A cheap watercolor pad for practice (or blended sceptor Winsor + Newton)
  - Inexpensive sketchbook
  
- **Brushes:**
  - Synthetic brushes are cheaper and acceptable
  - 1 inch flat watercolor brush
  - Number 6 or 8 Wash brush
  - Number 12 or 14 round brush
  - Number 8 round brush
  - Number 6 rigger brush
  
- **Other:**
  - Plastic palette
  - Paper towels
  - 2 Jars for water
  - 2B and 6B pencil
  - Kneaded eraser
  - Masking tape
  - Non-porous backboard slightly larger than paper

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## NEW POLICY RE: CLASS SUPPLIES

To ease confusion for beginning artists, all materials will be provided for the first two class meetings of all adult, **Beginner-level classes**. These classes will be noted in the class description with "Some supplies included." Students in beginner-level classes will be given guidance during their first class meeting on which supplies to purchase for the remainder of the season. Adult students in **Intermediate- or Advanced-level classes**, or any class without the notation listed above, are expected to purchase all supplies on their class supply list and bring those supplies to the first class meeting.

Some workshops require **unconventional materials** (non-art materials, household objects, etc.). Most items can be found easily; however, if you have any difficulty obtaining these materials, do contact the School Office who may be able to recommend an alternative option.
