



## Winter 2018 Class Supply List: Intermediate Watercolor / 8WAC42TA and 8WAC42WB

*(Please see new policy re: class supplies below this list.)*

- **Watercolor Paints in Tubes:** (artist grade preferred)
  - 1 Cool Yellow: Lemon Yellow, Winsor Yellow or Hansa Yellow Light.
  - 1 Warm Yellow: Indian Yellow, Yellow Orange or New Gamboge.
  - 1 Cool Red: Permanent Alizarin, Permanent Rose or Anthraquinoid Red.
  - 1 Warm Red: Poppy, Perylene Scarlet or Scarlet Lake.
  - 1 Greenish Blue: Phthalo Blue or Winsor Blue-green shade.
  - 1 Reddish Blue: French Ultramarine Blue or Ultramarine Blue.
  - 1 Brown: Burnt Sienna
  
  - Following colors are useful but optional:
    - Winsor Newton Raw Siena (a warm neutralized yellow).
    - Quinacridone Gold
    - Cobalt Blue
    - Cerulean Blue
    - Permanent Magenta
- **Paper:**
  - 140 lb. Cold Press Watercolor paper or pad, rough or smooth at least 10" x 14"
  - Waterford, Arches or Fabriano papers are preferred. You can buy in blocks, separate sheets or books.
  - Inexpensive sketchbook- for planning paintings and testing colors.
- **Brushes:**
  - Two Silver Black Velvet round watercolor brushes are recommended- a #4 or #5 and a #10 or #12. This is a synthetic/squirrel hair blend.
  - Two flat brushes- a soft ash brush (1 & ½ or 2 inches wide- a Winsor & Newton series 965 is a good wash brush).
  - One ¼ inch flat short haired synthetic stiff brush.
  - Other sizes are optional.
- **Other:**
  - Plastic palette- watercolor palette with a large mixing area or a white plate for mixing colors.
  - Plastic cutps or a muffin tin for mixing larger washes- should have openings large enough for a wash brush.
  - Misting bottle
  - Sea sponge
  - Paper towels

- 2 Jars for water
- 3B and 6B pencil
- Kneaded eraser
- Artist tape or masking tape
- Non-absorbent backboard slightly larger than paper. Plexiglass 1/8" thick works great. You can get it cut to desired size at Lowes.

#### NEW POLICY RE: CLASS SUPPLIES

To ease confusion for beginning artists, all materials will be provided for the first two class meetings of all adult, **Beginner-level classes**. These classes will be noted in the class description with "Some supplies included." Students in beginner-level classes will be given guidance during their first class meeting on which supplies to purchase for the remainder of the season. Adult students in **Intermediate- or Advanced-level classes**, or any class without the notation listed above, are expected to purchase all supplies on their class supply list and bring those supplies to the first class meeting.

Some workshops require **unconventional materials** (non-art materials, household objects, etc.). Most items can be found easily; however, if you have any difficulty obtaining these materials, do contact the School Office who may be able to recommend an alternative option.
