- Acrylic or oil paint
- Various size brushes with stiff bristles
 - #5,#7 bright
 - #8, #10 flats
 - #2,#3 rounds
 - filberts
- Linseed oil and turpenoid if using oil paint
- Two clean containers for media
- Gloss or Matte Acrylic Medium if using acrylics
- Plexiglass or plastic palette
- Palette knife
- Painting surface and size of your choice
 - Canvas Boards
 - Canvas Paper
 - Stretched Canvases
 - Gessoed Masonite or wood
- Paper towels and/or rags
- Sketch pad (approx. 9x12)
- Masking tape
- Drawing pencils

NEW POLICY RE: CLASS SUPPLIES

To ease confusion for beginning artists, all materials will be provided for the first two class meetings of all adult, **Beginner-level classes**. These classes will be noted in the class description with "Some supplies included." Students in beginner-level classes will be given guidance during their first class meeting on which supplies to purchase for the remainder of the season. Adult students in **Intermediate- or Advanced-level classes**, or any class without the notation listed above, are expected to purchase all supplies on their class supply list and bring those supplies to the first class meeting.

Some workshops require **unconventional materials** (non-art materials, household objects, etc.). Most items can be found easily; however, if you have any difficulty obtaining these materials, do contact the School Office who may be able to recommend an alternative option.
