



## 2018 Winter Session: Life Drawing Open Studio

### *Policies, Schedules & Information*

Register for our Life Drawing Open Studios and enjoy 3-hour sessions working on your own without instruction, in a relaxed community of fellow artists, now in our new, light-drenched studios. We provide easels, small tables, drawing boards, and stools. You bring your own artists' supplies and work at your own pace.

We work with experienced models, both male and female, clothed and nude, providing a variety of poses. Each session will include a series of short warm-up poses as well as at least one long pose.

Advanced registration is recommended because space is **limited to 20 participants**, first come first served. Open studio sessions are open to serious high school students under the age of 18 with written consent from a parent/guardian.

## WHAT TO EXPECT

If you have never taken a figure drawing class with live models before, here are some things you can expect:

- Models come in every shape, size and gender. Life drawing classes require you to spend 3 hours looking closely at the models, both with and without clothes. These models are professionals and are there to help you learn so you don't need to feel uncomfortable.
- Life drawing classes are meant to be quiet and discreet so plan not to go in or out of the studio unless absolutely necessary.
- Bring plenty of paper and drawing supplies with you.
- Please arrive early to prepare your station. Our models will start their poses on time.
- You will have short breaks during the class so the models can rest.
- Depending on how many students are in the studio, you may be able to move around to get a different view of the model.
